Faculty, students and staff play a vital role in helping resolve alleged violations of the EWU Student Code of Conduct and/or EWU Policy 402-01 (Sexual Misconduct, Interpersonal Violence & Title IX Responsibilities). Volunteers play a critical role in adjudicating student and employee conduct matters. Volunteers are trained to serve and contacted throughout the year on an as-needed basis to hear conduct cases or serve as advisors for respondents or complainants in Title IX hearings.

### Eligibility to Serve:

- Staff/faculty volunteers must be full-time employees at Eastern Washington University.
- If selected to serve, volunteers will be required to complete all training sessions related to the role(s) they are selected for and what is expected of them in the role(s) they are selected for.
- Faculty/staff who are not present or actively engaged may be released from serving.

### Application and Selection Process

Every year, EWU seeks faculty/staff to serve a (renewable) term of one academic year. These are highly-regarded positions and serving as a volunteer in any of the role(s) listed above require demonstrating the utmost level of confidentiality and professionalism.

All applications will be reviewed, and selected individuals will be invited for an interview, which will be conducted remotely.
