




Classical Liberalism

- Free Market Economy
- The state is there to protect rights
- Understood Humans as Homo-Economicus focused on exchange





Homo-Economicus

Important Differences


Classical Liberalism

- An 'Economic Man' with tendencies to barter and exchange
- Seek Goods and Services via the Marketplace
- Can makes value judgments outside of Economic Thought

Neoliberalsim

- An 'Economic Man' in constant competiton
- Seeks to acquire all things via the Marketplace
- Economic Paradigm: Human Capital
- 'Cannot/Should Not' make ethical judgements counter to the maximization of self investment
