This assignment is designed to help you think about each section individually, and to consider how each contributes to the overall podcast. Please answer the questions below for each section, and then write a summary of the episode.

Section 1

Time stamp at the beginning 0:00 Time stamp at the end 6:15

What were some of the most important ideas you learned in this section?

Never confess to finding a dead body. You will them become a suspect of murder.

What examples were used in this section to illustrate these ideas?
